**Community**

A group of people living in the same area

**Postcode**

**Address**

A place where someone lives

**Route**

A set of directions that can be used to get from one place to another

**Street**

**Human Features**

Things that are built by humans

**Physical Features**

A natural feature such as water, mountains and lakes
